12. During "Project C," this city's police forces used fire hoses and police dogs to disperse protesters, many of whom were children.

14. In 1968, Dr. King traveled to Memphis to help settle this labor dispute.
15. Dr. King stayed at this motel while in Memphis, one of the few hotels in town which catered to African Americans.
